As the first position of its kind at Inaphaea BioLabs, this is a unique opportunity for someone to take ownership of the role, implementing new strategies and processes to optimise lab efficiency. Key Responsibilities:

Stock Management:

- Conduct routine checks of general consumable stores and place re-orders to ensure continuous stock availability.
- Assist in inventory tracking and maintain accurate records for reagents, consumables, and other supplies.

Waste Management:

Manage laboratory waste disposal in compliance with regulations.

Equipment Maintenance:

- Perform general lab equipment maintenance.
